1.	533400-3.1-RS-2012-R2	3.1 TN	2	2012	16.531,10 €	Center E8 Ms Aleksandra Maldziski	CV: Curriculum Voluntarius	<p>Center E8 proposes to host a Training entitled "CV: Curriculum Voluntarius" for young people from Serbia, Croatia, Kosovo, Montenegro, Macedonia, Italy, Portugal, Romania and Greece from 17th - 23rd, March 2013 in Belgrade, the capital of Serbia. Main goal of this project is to kindle young people's spirit of initiative and promote volunteering as an instrument for young people's active participation in society. This Training will bring together youth workers and youth activists to explore diverse ways of engaging youth in volunteering activities on grass root level. The participants will have a space to share their experience and know-how and will also be provided with various tools and techniques that can help them motivate young people to be active volunteers in their local communities.</p> <p>The methods used in this training are specially focused on non-formal education and peer education. We will hold several workshops related to the organisation of the volunteers in non-governmental organizations, work of volunteers, decision-making involving volunteers, learning process of the volunteers, recognition of personal competence and skills and active participation of volunteers in society. Moreover, special focus will be placed on stimulating unemployed young people's mobility and active participation in society through volunteering.</p> <p>At the end of the training the participant shall do a street action which will focus on raising awareness of the local public about the value and importance of youth participation and volunteerism. In addition, participants will have a chance to meet other cultures and to exchange experiences, creating this way an European network that can develop synergies and cooperation between organizations with the aim to integrate intercultural perspectives in their work.</p>

The project will be focused on developing specific competencies in educational games designing for youth workers, facilitators, trainers on topics related to social exclusion and global challenges.</p> <p>Beneficiaries will explore deeper different social thematic explore the steps required for developing successful educational games (that could be used in youth projects, communities or training/workshops, schools)and develop concrete games which will be implemented, tested and evaluated during the training itself and later one disseminated and promote among other youth organizations. Main aim of the project is to raise the capacity of youth organization to contribute to a cohesive and active society.</p> <p>Specific objectives :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) To increase the level of knowledge in topics like: environmental, poverty, gender equality, other global issues, social exclusion, human rights, intercultural dialogue, etc; 2) To develop practical competencies in designing and applying new educational games in youth work 3) To develop pro-active attitudes to approach excluded young people 4) To increase the level of creativity, innovation, self confidence and trust in educational games; 5) To enable youth workers to act as educational games multipliers in their communities 6) To contribute to a long term change in educational approach in youth field.

Project targets youth workers willing to take the lead of facilitating intercultural acceptance in our projects and communities.</p> <p>Project themes are: cultural diversity, cultural minorities, intercultural and interreligiousdialogue, intercultural learning.</p> <p>Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sharing our realities on cultural diversity - Mapping identity related issues in our local and European youth work - Promoting cultural diversity as strength in everyday life, as opposed to feeling of fear and unknown to many youngsters nowadays - Promoting intercultural dialogue as instrument in acquiring the knowledge and aptitudes for dealing with a more open and more complex environment - Enabling participants to define, plan, develop and lead quality youth projects which contribute to acceptance of diversity in society - Further developing their competences in communication, conflict transformation and teamwork for quality leadership and facilitation of intercultural dialogue - Introducing YiA and developing new projects among partners with topic of intercultural dialogue and involving cultural minorities <p>The training course is based on the pedagogical understanding of the Council of Europe and the European Commission Partnership Programme and our own experience and expertise in youth work and intercultural dialogue. The training course will follow the nonformal education approach, principles and methods.</p> <p>All partners will be involved in preparation, implementation and evaluation and follow-up phase and activities during the training course.</p> <p>Applicant of the project (CJCD) is also hosting the activity in Serbia.</p>

However, it is abundantly clear that young prospective entrepreneurs face numerous barriers.</p> <p>So, we plan to support young people overcoming different obstacles and facilitate the acquisition of the entrepreneurship key competence and enhance its development within the participants' communities, thus improving the role of young people in society and the economy.</p> <p>Furthermore, thanks to the choice over non-formal education methods, we intend to actively involve the participants in the diverse working moments, sharing opinions, cooperating amongst themselves, learning from each other and ultimately conceiving project ideas together. Hence, we expect to generate an experience of great personal and professional growth with significant development of skills and competences that promote and facilitate the preparation and realization of projects and activities about youth entrepreneurship.</p> <p>Likewise, we intend to work as an important platform for discovering and sharing best practices, thus applauding examples of successful enterprise and spreading an idea of a responsible entrepreneur as great contributor to social development through the creation of comic strips which will represent the main outcome of the course and will be distributed to a wide audience of young people throughout</p>

Mladih Ms Ana Jovanovic	Evaluating Valuable Strength	Project Evaluating Valuable Strength, started as an idea of former EVS volunteers that were sent or hosted by organization OSMEH in period of last 3 years. While doing EVS in Serbia, international volunteers had chance to learn a lot about project management and Youth in Action program in general. After finishing their voluntary service in Belgrade or abroad, they all started to get very active in the field of youth work and non formal education. Considering this, our cooperation continued, so they came up to the idea to present a training course, which suppose to take bottom up approach on learning outcomes of EVS program. We have involved 5 partners that were working with us on EVS projects in last 3 years and 4 partners from the region with who we cooperate in other projects, but they have rich experience in EVS program. Participating countries are: Serbia, Albania, Kosovo UN1244, Bosnia and Herzegovina, FYR Macedonia, Sweden, Italy, Greece, Germany and Hungary. Each partner should send 3 participant that are former EVS volunteer, EVS mentors or project coordinators. For 8 days, we will talk about strengths and weaknesses of EVS program, experiences and ideas and motivation to be active citizenship and plan future projects that will help us to continue the successful collaboration that we have already started. The other important milestone of the project is developing a new evaluation form specified for EVS projects that will be disseminated among partner organizations. Project will take place from 1st to 9th of April 2013, and it will involve 30 participants and 3 international trainers. Project will involve methods of non-formal education, which include creating a friendly and confident environment in purpose of stimulating learning processes of the participants. Activities will include: working in small groups, power point presentations, simulation activities, role plays, presentations, public speech, project management and simulation exercises.

Objectives of this training are: - to provide theoretical inputs and discuss meaning of social change with the focus on poverty; to explore their role and role of their organizations in this field within their own communities. - to provide concrete skills to participants in order to be able to use photography as a tool that will show their perception on poverty, and stimulate their reflection on prevention, ways out and consequences of poverty. - to show ways how to efficiently use photography in order to raise public concern (by organizing exhibitions, events, online content, publications, etc.). The training will take place in Becej, Serbia and last for 7 days including travelling days. It will involve participants from United Kingdom, Latvia, Belgium, Armenia, Romania, Turkey, Albania, Macedonia and Serbia and professional trainers and specialists in the field of poverty, social change, photography and international youth work. Working methodology will be focused on non formal learning – through out sharing personal and cultural experiences, theoretic and field work and creative process of photography development.

The participating youth and organizations have different experiences in social inclusion of young deaf people in social life and this youth exchange will be first step in building an international platform for long term exchange of deaf and hard of hearing people in the framework of active European citizenship of young people with disabilities and social inclusion. The exchange will be implemented in Belgrade by Group "Let's..." from 04.-11. March 2013 and will include 39 young participants (13 from all three countries: Serbia, Slovenia and Croatia) with their 6 youth leaders and 3 sign language translators who are necessary because group will be mixed of young people with and without disability with ratio of 50% deaf and hard of hearing people and other 50% young people without disability from all there participating countries.

								<p>The program will contain interactive workshops in the field of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • active European citizenship with special focus on artistic and cultural opportunities and possibilities for deaf people, • transfer of existing European practices in local communities, • intercultural dialog with specific focus on culture of deaf people • dance workshop with the aim to encourage and empower deaf and hard of hearing people to take an active role by trying to place themselves in the role of dancers and choreographer. <p>During the exchange, we will also organize other social activities with the goal to deepen interaction between participants and broader local and national community (public presentation of project, public discussion with broader society and local visits).</p>

YE will take place in Vrnjacka Banja (Serbia) on the theme of active participation young people with fewer opportunities. Exchange will take place in Mart 2013 and will bring together 47 young people from 9 European countries. The main goal of this exchange is to show young people with fewer opportunities how to take active role in the life of their community, provide them possibility to get new skills and knowledge and increase their ability to create projects tackling and solving the common community problems. Young people with fewer opportunities are facing many problems. The source of this we can find in fact that the society is not aware of their problems and has no information about the lives of young people with fewer opportunities. Lack of information can very easily lead to misunderstandings and potential conflicts.</p> <p>To change the perception of majority is significantly important that people with fewer opportunities will raise their voices and stop being silent that they will take active role in their local communities. It is more than important in small cities where no bridging activities as implemented for example by NGOs or local authorities. In these cases is significantly important that these young people will become active – will become drivers of the change and they will start to take steps to change the situation.</p> <p>In help of the process of sharing knowledge, opinion and attitude of the topic, the project will use non-formal educational methods like discussions, workshops, group work, role play, Analysis of the situation or case, brainstorming, practical work, etc.</p>
