Aim is to give participants greater knowledge and skills to use the medium of puppetry in their work with youngsters, especially with youngsters with fewer opportunities, in order to make the youth work more "inclusive" and "culturally diverse". The project uses puppets to tell stories, create possible solutions and disseminate information on discrimination, intolerance and exclusion in an informal and often humorous way. The working programme combines the three processes: of puppet busker theatre, inclusion and intercultural learning. The final performance will trigger discussions about inclusion and include interaction between the audience (local community) and the Puppet Power participants. The activity will take in place in Kovacica, Serbia from 22nd until 30th of July 2010. This objective will be achieved through youth volunteer exchange - by organizing an ecological youth camp at the Vršac Mountains in Serbia, for a period of 14 days between July 4th and 18 , 2010, with the participation of 32 young volunteers aged 18-25 from Serbia, Sweden, Romania and Bosnia Herzegovina (8 from each state). During their visit, they will do several concrete actions in the ground, in order to help the stakeholder of the protected resource "Vršačke planine" in the implementation part of the active protection, such as: demarcation of the inner boundaries in Level I zone of protection, improvement and expansion of habitats for rare and protected species of flora and fauna (removal of shrubs from the meadow vegetation; cleaning and enlarging the bar and the formation of winter quarters for amphibians; production and installation of feeders, waterers and bird boxes; repairs and maintenance of tourist signalization and movables (painting and protection of info-panels, signposts, benches and litter bins); garbage collection and through a series of educational workshops, programs and activities.

It is common knowledge that they are facing certain difficulties regarding their mobility and participation, as well as their access to the public institutions and their role as active citizens. In Serbia, this topic is not even addressed and there is no systematic approach to topic. Young people from rural areas are disadvantaged compared to their peers in urban areas. They have more problems accessing formal education and they have almost never been able to access non-formal education and trainings. NGO Libero intends to organize this project in order to address the importance of social inclusion of young people from rural areas. Main aim of the project will be to find way to include rural youth to participate in youth work, democratic processes and society building on the way to EU. It will gather 28 young people living in rural areas from Serbia, Macedonia, Croatia and Slovenia. It is about to be held in Novi sad and it is to last for 8 days. In order to increase the level of participation of youngsters in rural areas and to improve the possibilities of networking and mobility within the region, participants of this seminar will be provided with an opportunity to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - learn and discuss about the ways to promote active youth participation and youth activities - exchange opinions and expedencies about youth work and youth policies for rural youth. - discuss about possible ways to improve the mobility and participation of youngsters in rural areas - present their ideas for development of rural participation - -discuss opportunities offered by EU for rural youth as well as their vision of European citizenship and EU integration. Seminar will be based on non formal educational methodology which will include team building games, energizers, training sessions, workshops and other forms of group work and peer to peer methods of education.
